## COMMUNITY

Del Campo High School opened in 1963 and is located in the suburban community of Fair Oaks. Fair Oaks is located 12 miles east of the state capital in downtown Sacramento, California.

## SCHOOL

Del Campo High School is one of nine comprehensive public high schools in the San Juan Unified School District. Del Campo places a strong emphasis on college preparatory courses and provides exemplary academic, career, athletic, and extra-curricular programs. The Del Campo Air Force ROTC has been ranked as one of the top in the nation and is consistently recognized as a "Distinguished Unit." The Decamhian is one of the most highly regarded yearbooks in the country and has earned many major awards in scholastic journalism. Del Campo has four Career Technical Education (CTE) pathways: Business Entrepreneurship (Kids Helping Kids), a 501(C)(3) non-profit organization which serves to help young children with various needs ranging from college-bound students in need of computers, to cancer-stricken children in pediatric units; Broadcast and Video Productions (DC Daily), a SEVA award-winning live broadcast, awards included first place in documentary and school newscast; Fire Technician/Emergency Medical Response, a course where students gain first hand knowledge in fire science and CPR; and the Information and Communications Technology Pathway consists of three courses that prepare students for industry certification in the field of IT support. These classes include: Computer Science: IT Fundamentals, AP Computer Science Principles, and Computer Science: IT Essentials. DC has an outstanding AVID program consisting of approximately 215 students. Our Mock Trial class won Sacramento County Championships. With over 50% of our student body participating in athletics, Del Campo provides a comprehensive athletic program in the San Joaquin Section of the CIF.

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

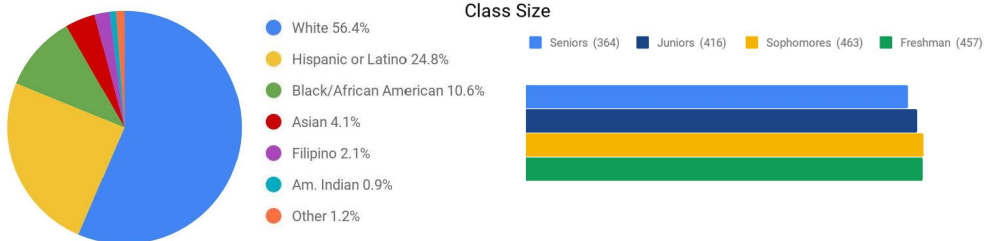

## BLOCK SYSTEM

The school operates on a four-by-four block system. There are two blocks in the school year with four courses per block. Each block is 18 weeks with each course equivalent to a **year's** worth of study that is similar to the traditional two semester school. Within each block are two terms which last 9 weeks. Each term (9 weeks) is equivalent to one **semester**. Most courses are 18 weeks (one block or two terms) while others are 9 weeks only one term). Each term students earn 5 credits for each course – 10 per block. Students can earn up to 320 credits by their senior year with a required minimum of 280.

## MARKING/GRADING SYSTEM

Four-point scale of A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and F=0. Honors and Advanced Placement add one grade point for each class of C grade or better. Both weighted and un-weighted grades are reflected on the transcript, as well as a state GPA that excludes all ninth grade, physical education and ROTC grades. Courses taken at a community college do not appear on the transcript. San Juan Unified District Schools do not report, nor include, student class rank on student transcripts.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

280 credits are required for students who attend Del Campo for four years. Classes completed with a grade of D- or better earn 5 credits per term/semester. The San Juan USD has adopted new graduation requirements beginning with the class of 2023, both graduation requirements are listed.

## COVID

Del Campo began distance learning on March 16th, 2020 because of COVID 19. For 3 weeks, students were given "enrichment" materials; no new content was taught. Beginning week 4, students were presented with new content and followed a prescribed schedule. Attendance was not taken during this time. Students' grades defaulted to "credit/no credit." Students could receive letter grades upon request. Grades of "credit/no credit" were not calculated into the GPA. Due to distance learning barriers, we were not able to capture complete post graduate data for seniors. For the 20/21 school year, students are in "Distance Learning" with a structured schedule. Attendance is taken daily through synchronous and asynchronous learning. Letter grades will be given for each class.
