For this assignment you and your group members will be creating your own version of a classic **FAIRY TALE** with a few fractured twists. Your **FRACTURED FAIRY TALE** will be written in children's book format with colorful graphics included on each page of text.

Your FRACTURED FAIRY TALE should:

1. Be **10 pages in length** with typed text and have at least **3 sentences per page**.
2. Contain a neatly drawn and colorful picture on each page.
3. Have a cover that contains the title of the book, a colorful graphic, and all the names of the authors and illustrators.
4. Be different from the original version, but the overall "flavor" of the story must be similar. It must be clear to the reader what fairy tale was fractured. See attached page for some ideas.
5. Not include the following significant item: _____ . It has been stolen from your fairy tale and given to another group to use in their story.
