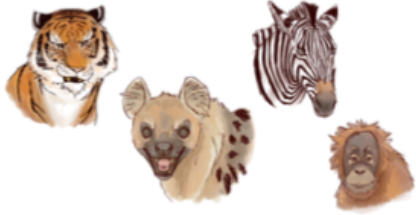

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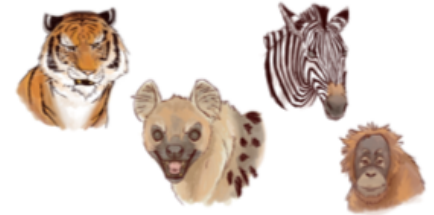
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# ANNOTATIONS

## Minimum Requirement

**6 annotations** per reading section – **2** of each **type**.

### Questions

Highlight sentences or passages that you have **questions** about. Write questions in the margins. **Questions** can include, but are not limited to:

- Areas that are confusing or troubling about the plot or character interactions
- Symbolism or imagery
- Unfamiliar vocabulary – Must look up and define
- Allusions – Must look up and explain

### Connections

As you read the novel, you may find that you have a personal **connection** with a character or a specific event that occurs. Highlight passages or sentences related to your personal **connections** and then write an annotation about why you selected the passage.

### Major Themes

**Theme** can be described as a unifying idea that is a recurrent element in a literary work. Highlight passages or sentences related to what you consider to be important **theme**(s) of the novel and then annotate why you selected these

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
