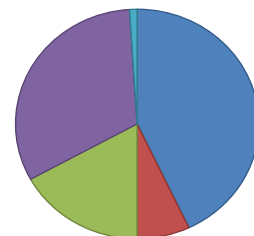
Our School

Mira Loma High School, a California Distinguished School educating International Baccalaureate Program students since 1991, is one of nine high schools in the San Juan Unified School District. MLHS prides itself on its six distinctive programs including: International Baccalaureate Middle Years (MYP), International Baccalaureate Diploma (DP), International Studies (IS), International Passport (IP), English Learner (EL) and Special Education. MLHS's programs have created a dynamic magnet for students in Mira Loma's neighborhood as well as surrounding cities. MLHS brings together the brightest and hardest working students in the region with the most diversity of thought and background. Newsweek recognized MLHS as one of the best high schools in 2015, ranking it 240th in the nation (157th factoring in poverty). In addition, U.S. News & World Report awarded Mira Loma a Silver Award. MLHS is accredited by the Western Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges, receiving in 2011 the maximum 6-year accreditation.

Our Community and Students

MLHS, a comprehensive public high school, serves 1,680 students in grades 9-12 and reflects our ethnically and culturally diverse surrounding community. Mira Loma sits in a well-established neighborhood with a mixture of urban and suburban areas. Adding to our diversity is San Juan USD's "Open Enrollment" policy that allows students to attend any of the nine high schools in the district. **Over 50% of Mira Loma students receive free or reduced-price lunch.** The school also serves more than 120 EL students with a growing refugee population and nearly 125 Special Education students. Our IB students show immense maturity and take initiative with the rigorous coursework they choose as well as their independent Personal Projects and Extended Essays. Approximately half of the IB students travel from other communities to belong to Mira Loma's IB Program, **the most well-established and successful IB Program in the region.** In addition, IB students are compassionate and global-thinkers through their 150 Creativity Action and Service hours.

Grading

Class Ranking: Beginning with the class of 2016, MLHS no longer ranks students.
GPA: Classes are graded on a four-point scale (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1). IB courses are graded to align with internationally established standards. For IB, Honors and AP courses, one point is added (A=5, B=4, etc.). Weighted and unweighted grade point averages are reported on the transcript. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA.
