

THE TEN MOST IMPORTANT RULES OF SPORTS-A-RAMA

The following rules are to be initialed by the student submitting an application and their parents. There is a space to initial next to each rule and two sets of initials are required for the application are required for the application to be accepted.

1. All school rules are enforced during Sports-a-Rama practice.
2. Rule 1 includes leaving campus. Students may only leave campus if they have checked out with their advisors and class officers. Once they have checked out, they will not be allowed to return to campus for that practice.
3. Students participants must have at least a 2.0 GPA by the ebd of both second semester grading periods.
4. Anyone on social probation, in homeschool, or in independent study may not participate in School-A-Rama
5. Coaches and class advisors will choose who participates in what event after a tryout process. This is at their discretion every year, and a student's participation in an event in the previous year does not guarantee them a spot in the current year.
6. As this is a team activity, participants are required to attend 20 out of 25 hours of practice detailed on the practice schedule. 5 hours is the MAXIMUM number of hours that may be missed and should be used for emergencies and/or other school activities.
7. Participants must treat all administrators, coaches, class officers, advisors, and the activities director with respect.
8. Participants must be wearing their practice shirts at practices to have their hours counted for that practice. The back of the shirts must be visible during practice so that participants can be identified by their number. Shirts may not be altered (i.e. cutting, writing, etc.)
9. Participants must follow all practice rules, as detailed in the rule book, at all times.
10. Participants MUST HAVE GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP to other teammates and classes. This means no booing or derogatory phrases. Unsportsmanlike behaviour during Sports-A-Rama can result in a deduction of class points based on the discretion of judges or the activities director, Mr. Posner.
