1. When crossing the street with other people, who looks?
 - A. The oldest person
 - B. The person on the left
 - C. Everybody looks
2. What is the first step in crossing the street?
 - A. Look for cars
 - B. Stop at the edge
 - C. Look to see if there are any cute dogs
3. What direction do you look before crossing?
 - A. Both ways
 - B. Left, right, and left again
 - C. Right, left, right
4. If a car stops, how do you know if it stopped for you?
 - A. Make eye contact with the driver
 - B. Look for turn signals and brake lights
 - C. Look at the wheels to make sure it is not moving
5. If a pedestrian signal is flashing the red hand, or has a small number counting down:
 - A. Run, because you don't have much time left
 - B. Wait for the next signal
 - C. Find some other place to cross
6. If crossing between parked cars, first:
 - A. Walk out to the street where you can see
 - B. Make sure there is enough space to squeeze through
